Making Better Policies for Food Systems




What are the challenges and achievements of food systems? What is the role of policies?

Identifying and addressing data gaps

- Existing data not granular enough or fragmented
- Inconsistent methodologies
- Limited info on effectiveness of policy instruments and synergies and trade-offs
- COVID-19 exposed the need for better data in specific areas
- Perfect information impossible – prioritize investments in data/evidence
- OECD work in 2021-2022
 - Narrative piece on food systems data gaps (2021)
 - “Deep dives” on food insecurity, gender, sustainability of food supply chains (2022)
 - Practical approaches for identifying, prioritising, and addressing data gaps (2022)
