Regional Consultations - Voluntary Guidelines on Gender Equality and Women's and Girls' Empowerment in the Context of Food Security and Nutrition

Latin America and the Caribbean

21-22 September 2021, 10.00 to 13.00 (Santiago time)¹

Welcome to the CFS Regional Consultation for Latin America and the Caribbean region. The consultation is part of the process for the preparation of the *Voluntary Guidelines on Gender Equality and Women's and Girls' Empowerment in the Context of Food Security and Nutrition*.

OBJECTIVE OF THE REGIONAL CONSULTATION

The Regional Consultation is an opportunity for CFS to receive inputs, comments and suggestions from regional stakeholders on how best to align the future *CFS Guidelines on Gender Equality and Women's and Girls' Empowerment in the context of Food Security and Nutrition* with regional and national priorities and needs. BACKGROUND DOCUMENT

The Regional Consultation will consist of presentations and plenary discussions framed by the [Zero Draft of the Guidelines](#). **Participants are encouraged to read the Zero Draft of the Guidelines before the Regional Consultation.**

The Zero Draft is made up of four parts:

The **first part** provides the background and rationale of the Guidelines, its objectives and information on its nature as well as its intended users.

The **second part** presents the core principles that underpin the Guidelines, taking into account CFS Vision of ending hunger and ensuring food security and nutrition for all, and for the progressive realization of the right to adequate food in the context of national food security.

The **third part** is organized into nine sections/themes. Each section presents a problem statement, a narrative and related policy areas for discussion. This part is intended to frame the discussions in the

consultations and inform the preparation of the upcoming versions of the document. It presents initial ideas regarding the issues and topics to be considered and discussed by CFS stakeholders. It does not present suggested text for the future Guidelines.

The **fourth part** includes provisions regarding the implementation of the future Guidelines and the monitoring of their use and application.

TIMETABLE (see [preliminary timetable](#))

Note: On Day 1 during the plenary discussion, participants will be invited to share their general comments, guided by the indicative questions provided in the box below. While on Day 2, the plenary discussion will focus on the sections/themes of the Zero Draft which were indicated as most relevant for the region by the participants at the time of registration. Information on the selected sections for discussion on Day 2 will be posted on this [webpage](#) a few days before the consultation.

Day 1:

- Welcome and introduction to the CFS policy process by the Chair of the CFS Open Ended Working Group on Gender (OEWG Chair).
- Keynote speeches on gender equality by renowned personalities.
- Presentation of the Zero Draft of the Guidelines by the OEWG Chair - Questions and Answers.
- Plenary discussion, led by the Facilitator: participants will be invited to share their general comments, referring to the Zero Draft of the Guidelines. The Facilitator will remind participants to strictly adhere to timekeeping rules (three minutes or less per intervention, as per the Facilitator's instructions).

Indicative guiding questions for plenary discussion:

- Does the Zero Draft appropriately capture the main challenges and barriers that hinder progress in achieving gender equality and the full realization of women's and girls' rights in the context of food security and nutrition in the region? If not, what do you think is missing or should be adjusted?
- Does **Part 2 of the Zero Draft** satisfactorily reflect the core principles which should underpin the Guidelines? If not, how do you propose to improve these principles?
- Do the nine sections of **Part 3 of the Zero Draft** comprehensively cover the policy areas to be addressed to achieve gender equality and the full realization of women's and girls' rights in the context of food security and nutrition? If not, what do you think is missing?

[Please note that the plenary discussion on Day 2 will focus on some of the sections/themes of Part 3, selected by participants at the time of registration – please keep your specific comments on these sections for Day 2].

- Does **Part 4** of the Zero Draft provide all the elements necessary for effective implementation and monitoring of the use and application of the Guidelines? If not, what do you propose to add or change?

- Wrap-up of Day 1 by CFS Senior Gender Expert.

Day 2

- Facilitated plenary discussion on 2-4 sections of Part 3 of the Zero Draft selected by participants at the time of registration. Each section will be introduced by a speaker, referring to the Zero Draft of the

Guidelines. Discussion questions will focus on policy areas and the recommendations to be prioritized taking into account regional circumstances.

- Wrap-up of the day and of the consultation by the CFS Senior Gender Expert.
- Closing remarks by the OEWG Chair.

REPORTING

The results of the Regional Consultation will be documented in a summary of the OEWG Chair, which will be made available soon after the consultation.
