

Conceptual Framework



What are the major inequalities and how do they affect the six dimensions of FSN?

- Access to food production assets and resources
- Inputs and finance
- Value chains and markets
- International trade
- Food environments
- Other areas/systems: wealth/income, health systems, sanitation/housing/water, education.





Systemic Drivers & Root Causes



- Culture and Social Norms
- Political economy & power asymmetries
- Fragility and conflict
- Climate and nature injustice
- Innovation and technology
- Demographic and health factors





Approaches to reducing inequalities in the food system



Principles:

- Focus on agency
- Address power
- Adapt to local context
- A portfolio of actions/approaches to reducing inequalities, e.g.
 - Equalize access to food production resources
 - Develop inclusive farmers' organizations
 - Boost public agricultural research with focus on disadvantaged groups
 - Adapt inclusive value chain approaches
 - Food retail environment planning



Transformations for positive structural change

- Transformative actions:
 - > Right to Food
 - Addressing agency and power through inclusive governance
 - A holistic approach to climate and sustainability
 - Universal access to services and social protection
 - Data and knowledge revolution
