Regional Action Plan 2013-2017

Technical Assistance (TA) in the region is guided by:

- the Regional Action Plan (RAP) which assigns the responsibility of the technical assistance component to FAO,
- 11 RAP outputs to be produced with specific TA activities in the region in 5 years
- a target to cover 20 countries by 2017.
- New methodologies from Research component and best practices in the region
- TA process involves
 - Preparation of SPARS in selected countries
 - Implementing new methodologies/improving existing ones as per short term priority needs of the country
- SPARS process produces 4 main documents/outputs
 - a Roadmap to prepare SPARS
 - an IdCA Report
 - a country proposal paper
 - The SPARS document itself

How TA is implemented

- Each year 4-5 courtiers are selected. Work in progress in 15 countries.
- SPARS preparation is undertaken as per SPARS Guidelines and involves 3 Phases
 - Launching-
 - A Roadmap is prepared which provides the time-table and the activities leading to SPARS preparation
 - Assessing
 - An IdCA is undertaken and IdCA report prepared
 - CAQ canvassed to generate Country Capacity Indicators
 - A Country Proposal Paper (CPP) is prepared to reflect country priority needs
 - Planning
 - SPARS strategy and plans elaborated
 - · SPARS document prepared
- Entire process takes about a year and 4 country missions with support from national and international consultants and NSC
- CPPs are submitted for RSC approval on specific improvement activities that can be implemented with GS funds
- A Technical Working Group (TWG) has been constituted to examine technical issues and recommend country activities for RSC approval
- Approved CPP activities are implemented with GS funds

Technical Working Group (TWG)

Terms of Reference and Constitution

- ✓ provide a platform for technical discussions on issues arising from country proposals and provide feedback to the RSC
- ✓ discuss technical assistance provided to selected countries and suggest good practices at the regional level
- ✓ advise on suitability and operationalization of new methods and technologies from the research component and their implementation in Asia Pacific region
- ✓ advise on appropriateness of the broad strategic approach in preparing SPARS based on IdCA findings in the selected countries
- First Meeting of TWG
 - ✓ SPARS documents of 4 countries were discussed



Recommendations of TWG (1)

SPARS

- Matching IdCA findings with solutions proposed
- Organize SPARS within NSDS framework (if it exists) or other development plans – including the alignment of time periods
- To be cognizant of data needs (SDG monitoring, etc.)
- Roles and responsibilities of stakeholders clearly identified
- Coordination models at national and sub-national levels
 - Task force (Bangladesh), MOU (Indonesia and Philippines), and bottom-up approaches (Samoa).
- Role of administrative reporting systems
 - Admn. Rep System, Sample Survey, and Blended (Admin + Sample Survey) systems

Recommendations of TWG (2)

- Advocacy of SPARS implementation
 - Champions at highest levels (Improving statistics as an economic objective Myanmar)
- Improving Human resource (in numbers and capacity)
- Targeted Training (basic, job-specific, management of activities, and advanced topics)
- Guidelines/ Toolkit on collecting agricultural statistics from existing census/ surveys
 - Experience of Samoa [modular approach]; SPC [Standardized HIES]

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Broad TA Areas in IdCA Reports

- · National Minimum Set of Core Data
 - Data gaps bridged
 - Data quality improved
- SPARS prepared and implemented
- Specific Country proposal activities implemented
- Specific Methodological Issues
 - Improving agricultural statistics for National Accounts
 - Better methods for data collection
 - Development of Survey Calendars/ Integrated survey framework
 - Develop Coordination mechanisms (conflicting statistics)
 - Food Balance Sheets, Cost of Production statistics, Ag census/surveys
- Meeting data needs of the line Ministries
 - In-season periodic assessments/ forecasting for policy decisions
 - Improving Administrative Reporting Systems (crops, livestock, fisheries)
- Use of ICT (GIS/GPS/RS) for data collection, processing and dissemination
- Manuals/Instructions for field statistical activities

TA Implementation: Some highlights

- Improved Governance/coordination among stakeholders
 - RNR Statistics Committee set up as a permanent body in Bhutan
 - Steering Committee and Technical Committee constituted in Lao PDR
 - SPARS being developed as a component of NSDS in Myanmar: FAO leads ARS Cluster Group
- Improved efforts at resource mobilization
 - SPARS being Coordinated with WB STATCAP project in Indonesia
 - Government mobilizing support for its 8th NSEDP. SPARS requirements presented to Sectoral Working Group for Agriculture and Rural Development (SWG-ARD).
- South-South Cooperation facilitated
 - Study tour of MAIL Afghanistan to NCFC India on use of remote sensing for better agricultural statistics
- Special Approach for Pacific Small Island Countries
 - Workshop organized for developing a Pacific Strategy for Agriculture and Fishery Statistics
