Why is SSPARS key to Global Strategy?

- Second Pillar: Integration of agricultural statistics in the national statistical system
- Better understand impact of agriculture on key policies
 - Poverty reduction
 - Food security
 - Trade policy: imports and exports
 - Increasing agricultural productivity
 - Better prices for small holders
- Avoid duplication for policy makers: coordination of collection, analysis and dissemination of data
- Greater mobilization of resources





SSPARS Results in Peru

- For the Agricultural Statistical System
 - Better assessment of data quality and capacities
 - Better understanding of user needs and gaps
 - Better understanding of opportunities
 - Establishment of Mission and Vision
 - Definition of Strategic Objectives
 - Methods for implementation, monitoring and evaluation

- Meet user needs, timely data, availability, quality of statistics
 - Build national staff capacity, increased coordination,
 - enable improved methodologies, better governance








How the SSPARS in Peru meets the 3 Pillars of the Global Strategy

GS Pillars	SSPARS
<i>Pillar 1.</i> Identifying a minimal set of core data and determining national priorities.	It covers the economic dimension. Social and environmental data are out of its scope.
<i>Pillar 2.</i> Integrating agriculture into NSS.	Legal requirements and coordination ASS-NSS Building of a master sample frame for agriculture. Design and implementation of an integrated scheme.
<i>Pillar 3.</i> The sustainability of agricultural statistics through governance and statistical capacity building.	Pillars Governance and Capacity.

How SSPARS benefits to the statistical system in Peru

- Implementation of evidence-based agricultural policies;
 - Improved confidence of national and international users of statistics
 - Peru is part of International Code of Good Statistical Practices
 - Plan to extend the Code to Agriculture Statistics
 - Improved advocacy for statistics together with NSS
 - Better coordination with NSS and NSDS
