GSA Membership Overview

The Global Shea Alliance currently has 380 members from 28 countries.

- Collectors Registered cooperatives or organized groups of shea kernel collectors. Members include Pagsung Shea Pickers Association (Ghana), REKAF (Burkina Faso), and RPBHC (Burkina Faso).
- Handcrafted Butter Producers Registered cooperatives or organized groups that process shea butter in African villages. Members include UGPPK (Burkina Faso) and Tungteiya Shea Butter Extraction (Ghana).
- Suppliers Companies involved in the purchase of shea kernels or shea butter for the purpose of processing or trading. Members include AAK, IOI Loders Croklaan, Wilmar International, and Ghana Nuts Ltd.
- Brands and Retailers Companies that market products containing shea butter to consumers.
 Members include The Hershey Company, Nestle, The Body Shop, The Clorox Company, and L'Occitane.
- **Supporters** Non-governmental organizations and development partners supporting the shea industry. Members include ICCO, SNV, Tree Aid, and SOS Sahel.


