Jamaica's Intervention for Item 6: Agriculture and forestry linkages

Good afternoon

Distinguished Delegates, International Observers, Ladies and Gentlemen

Jamaica also welcomes and registers its support to a strong linkage between agriculture and forestry.

Recognising the significant impact of the COVID 19 pandemic, Jamaica has sought to strategically partner with various private and public sector stakeholders to boost food security through sustainable agroforestry practices and adopting climate smart farming technologies.
