International Poplar Commission (IPC)

- oldest Statutory Body of FAO, established in 1947
- FAO hosts the IPC Secretariat
- 37 member countries, more than half of which are developing economies



Main challenges of IPC

- Strong interest by poplar and willow specialists, but difficult to attract interest of other stakeholders and partners
- Country membership stagnant (1 new member since 2000)
- IPC and NPC's lack resources and face challenges in meeting their obligations
- Links with FAO mandate (sustainable livelihood, land-use and food security) is not always apparent
- Technical fields represented by working parties need to be more integrated into environmental and development issues
- Narrow geographic and technical focus (poplars and willows) calls for expansion of the thematic scope to include other genera and species.



IPC-Reform: Substance

- Expansion of the thematic scope to include in the portfolio other fast-growing species
- New title of the Commission:
 International Commission on Poplars and Other
 Trees Sustaining People and the Environment
- Thematic restructuring of the working parties
 - 1. Taxonomy, Nomenclature and Registration
 - 2. Domestication and Conservation of Genetic Resources
 - 3. Climate Change, Plant Health and Resilience to Threats and Crises
 - 4. Sustainable Livelihoods, Land-use, Products and Bioenergy
 - 5. Environmental and Ecosystem Services
 - 6. Policy, Communication and Outreach
- Strengthening national poplar commissions
- Increased funding of IPC-Secretariat
