Regional Soil Laboratory Network (RESOLAN) main needs - survey 2021

Countries are organized into Regional Soil Laboratory Networks (RESOLANs), the skeleton of GLOSOLAN. After the successful establishment of the Regional Soil Laboratory Networks for Asia (SEALNET) in 2017, Latin America (LATSOLAN) in 2018, and the Pacific (ASPAC), Africa (AFRILAB), Europe and Eurasia (EUROSOLAN) in 2019, GLOSOLAN successful launched the Regional Soil Laboratory Network for the Near East and North Africa (NENALAB) on 9 June 2020. Each RESOLAN has a Chair and one or two vice-Chairs that represent the regional networks at official events.

Every year, laboratories from a same region are given the opportunity to discuss about their priorities and needs, and their position on topics to be discussed at the annual GLOSOLAN meetings. Usually, RESOLAN meetings consist of three-four days training and one day for decision making. However, in 2020, GLOSOLAN made the decision to change the format of the meetings. Therefore, RESOLAN meetings will now consist of only one day focused on decision making since trainings will be provided in the form of webinars throughout the year







Have you ever been informed about the activities interesting your Regional Soil Laboratory Network?










Participation in Proficiency Tests (PT)


Have you ever joined a Proficiency Test (PT)?







Training topics – most needed ones







Awareness and support from the national and
