

Guidelines for Poster Submission

The selected posters will be displayed on the GSID24 webpage and at the venue during the poster session. Participants attending in-person are invited to print and bring their posters to the event. During all our previous symposia, the poster session was a great success and called the attention of many interested people. It is a fantastic opportunity to discuss your work with high level scientists and to have a substantial impact on policy-makers.

Please note that, due to strict FAO communication regulations, all posters will need to go through the FAO communication division for clearance before being uploaded on the official website.

For this reason, you are kindly requested to:

- Design your poster using the PowerPoint template for an A0 size. Each theme has its own specific template: [Theme 1](#) | [Theme 2](#) | [Theme 3](#) | [Theme 4](#).
- Poster sections: In almost all scientific posters you will find a title, author names and affiliations, introduction, methods, results, conclusions, and acknowledgements sections. Some other additions you might wish to include is a references section, for example.

Please use the following specifications:

- Titles - Verdana, size 80;
- Headings/subtitle - Verdana, size 45;
- Body text - Georgia, font size 32;
- Caption – Verdana, font size 22;
- Use pictures (minimum 300 dpi/ppi resolution) and clear graphs/tables and insert images in their actual size;
- Number all figures and tables. Please remember to place the captions for tables above the table and for figures below the figures (i.e. Fig.1: etc etc)
- Please do not exceed 550 words.

Please consider the poster layout requirements:

- It is important that your readers can navigate your poster and follow the logical progression of your work in an organized format.
- You are invited to choose a portrait format and to use a three-column style so that the reader will navigate the poster from column to column left-to-right.
- Make sure to leave clear borders around your columns, and good spacing between them so that they are easily distinguished.
