




INSOILFER grew!





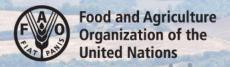
