

## What CESRA is and why it is important?

The Center of Excellence for Soil Research in Asia (CESRA) is a hub of research institutions for advancing research on soil protection, management and restoration, established in 2018 and hosted by the Kingdom of Thailand



Soils are fundamental to life on Earth, but human pressures on soil are reaching critical limits. Further loss of productive soils affects national economies and could potentially send millions of people into poverty. This loss is avoidable through SSM, which can increase food supply and provide a pathway for safeguarding and boosting ecosystem services. Achieving SSM will generate large benefits for all communities and nations.





## What CESRA is working on?

- To build the capacity of CESRA's Member countries on SSM following a demanddriven approach wherecountries will determine the needs
- Promote the exchange of knowledge, data, technical cooperation and experience in the Asian region by establishing the Asian Soil Information System (ASIS) as direct contributor to the Global Soil Information System (GLOSIS) • To encourage interdisciplinary and trans-disciplinary targeted soil research and the development of SSM toolsand techniques through technical cooperation
- using different approaches including South-South cooperation
- To promote education on Sustainable Soil and Land management (SSM and SLM), encourage partnership with different stakeholders and support informed decision-making





# What is the relation between the Asian Soil Partnership and CESRA?

The Asian Soil Partnership (ASP) was established in February 2012 to enhance collaboration between the 24 countries in the region. Through annual meetings and the development of implementation plans, national needs and priorities are translated into regional actions. In the framework of supporting the implementation of regional plans and actions the ASP decided to establish CESRA in 2018





# Why shall I join CESRA ?

Joining CESRA is a unique opportunity to:

- Cooperate and exchange knowledge and experience with other leading institutions on soil research in the region
- Participate to exchange programmes and trainings on soil-related topics in different countries
- Seek for funding sources and co-funding to support the cooperation among members

- Access a wide range of tools and research sites
- Connect with other networks within and beyond the region (e.g. Global Soil Laboratory Network and International Network of Soil Information Institutions)





## CESRA activities 2022

#### Workshop on Best practices of salt-affected soil management guidelines for Asia

- Gather SSM best practices from ASP member countries to upload in CESRA website for other members to learn (Thailand has already shared 12 practices on salt-affected soil)
- Develop SSM best practices of Asia starts from salt-affected soil
- Members of CESRA will be invited to join a workshop on development of salt-affected soil best practices in Thailand and Zoom around March 2023





## CESRA activities 2022

#### **E-training on Soil diagnostic skill on SSM**

- CESRA has established e training courses on Development of Diagnostic Skills of Soil Limitations for Sustainable Agriculture (Simplified self-soil diagnostic techniques) comprised of 7 subjects
  - Knowing soils for absolute beginners
  - Soil limitation and quality
  - Simplified techniques for diagnosis soil physical quality
  - Simplified techniques for diagnosis soil chemical quality
  - Simplified techniques for diagnosis soil biological quality
  - Soil limitation analysis by soil quality assessment
  - Soil limitation management
- To be launched in CESRA website on October 2022
