








March 9-10 2022 7th ASP meeting








Many other countries expressed the interest in joining the programme
→ call for promoters









- Experts from China, Indonesia, Japan, Mongolia, Nepal, and Thailand joined the International Network of Black Soils (INBS):
 - Report on the Global Status of Black Soils
 - Development of the Global Black Soil Distribution map
- Experts from the region also contributed and got involved in other **GSP technical networks** (INSAS, NETSOB, INFA) and the **GSP mapping activities** (GSOCmap, GSOCseq v1.0 and v1.1, GSASmap v1.0, GBSmap v.1.0)













- 123 soil laboratories from 20 Asian countries
- Establishment of National Soil Laboratory Networks
- Support GLOSOLAN in capacity development via webinar (Asian experts to act as trainers) and the recording of training videos (videos from Thailand and the Philippines already online)

Soil Atlas of Asia

- Conversion of national soil classification into the World Reference Base (WRB)
- National maps compiled in a single layer after the harmonization of borders
- The first version of the regional soil classification map will be endorsed by Editorial Board at its 5th meeting on 30 May and 1 June 2022
- The Atlas will be launch in summer 2022





Complementary to the preparation of the Soil Atlas of Asia, AFACI countries received intensive training on :

- Creating/maintaining national soil databases
- Soil property mapping
- Soil data management

As part of a Korean (RDA/AFACI) funded project on soil.
