





COMESA and AgWA working together to promote investment in AWM in Africa: Steps, Actions and Guiding Principles

This note presents the main outcomes of the discussions held during the FAO/AgWA and COMESA Roundtable from 19 to 20 May 2014 at FAO Headquarters in Rome. It outlines the plan of action for cooperation between FAO/AgWA and COMESA.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

The main Guiding Principles for AgWA and COMESA collaboration, as outlined during the roundtable discussions, are as follows:

1. To align actions within the CAADP Agenda at country level.

It is important to ensure that countries understand that AgWA's work supports the CAADP Agenda in order to get the necessary buy-in in each country for its specific CAADP stage.

2. To extend support to the regional level.

This includes sharing country experiences/project results in the region, as well as, providing support to the CAADP Regional Compact process.

3. To guide cooperation and joint work by an action oriented approach.

It is important to orient the work towards concrete and tangible results with positive impact.

4. To align cooperation with AgWA's priority areas of work.

AgWA has five priority areas of work: Advocacy, Partner harmonization, Resource mobilization, Generating and sharing knowledge and Capacity building.

5. The **Plan of Action** set against these principles should recognize activities to be implemented in the **short term** and **medium** to **long-term**. The time frame set for the short term plan is two years during which COMESA holds the **Chair** position of AgWA Steering Committee.

STEPS & ACTIONS

The steps and actions for cooperation between AgWA and COMESA have been structured in line with AgWA's five priority areas. These are:



✓	To take part in key events at African and international level, e.g. the COMESA Ministerial meeting on Agriculture, September 2014; and AU Summit, June 2014.	COMESSION
✓	To promote AgWA at key events related to CAADP process, e.g. Signing of the COMESA Regional CAADP Compact, July 2014; Signing of the CAADP Compact in Madagascar, June 2014; Pillar I training workshops, 2014 (Eritrea, Swaziland and Sudan); business meeting in Seychelles, Rwanda, Djibouti; and Compact Signature in Comoros, etc.	CONSTITUTE OF THE PARTY OF THE
