



# “Sustainable Agriculture for Economic Resiliency (SAFER) Program in **South Sudan**”

## Project Summary

The overall goal of this project is to improve the resilience of households, communities and agriculture systems in stressed and crisis level of food insecure regions of South Sudan. The specific outcome of the project is increased household food and nutrition security and income through increasing production and diversification of livelihoods in a manner which contributed to sustainability and fosters peaceful co-existence.


This project fills the nexus in South Sudan between humanitarian and development programming to promote sustainable livelihoods of vulnerable households and populations. It focuses on supporting livelihoods and building resilience and recovery by addressing household, community and agriculture sector level vulnerabilities that lead to food and nutrition insecurity among resident communities, returnees and internally displaced persons.

More specifically, the project will address the main threats of conflict, climate and economic insecurity by (i) restoring and diversifying livelihood; (ii) restoring and strengthening agriculture production practices; and (iii) strengthening community and intercommunal resource sharing and management practices.

<b>Overall Goal</b>	to improve the resilience of households, communities and agriculture systems in stressed and crisis levels of food insecure regions of South Sudan.
<b>Specific Objective</b>	to increase households' food and nutrition security and income through increasing production and diversification of livelihoods in a manner which contributes to sustainability and fosters peaceful co-existence.

Enhanced sustainable management of natural resources through promotion of peacebuilding dialogue process and safe access of bio-energy at community level  
**Sub-output 3.2:**  
Increased water access for livestock and farmers through the construction of most suitable infrastructure




**Sub-output 1.1:**
