Updated 2023-2025 Programme of work

Introduction

- 1. The working document on "Intersessional activities by WECAFC Secretariat: Coordination of the activities of the Advisory Groups, the IWG/Strategic reorientation process, the Executive Committee and other major actions to support the achievement of the goals and objectives of the Commission" (WECAFC/XIX/2023/13) presented the progress made in the intersessional period. A relatively appreciable share of the 2022-2024 workplan was achieved, consistent with the short span of the intersession, the pending assignments from the 18th Session¹, and the level of responsiveness of WECAFC members. This includes a continued increase in the periodic meetings of the Executive Committee, surpassing the required number (at least once a year) in the rules of procedure, and activity of four working groups, with a particularly engaging intersession of the working group of Fisheries using anchored/moored fish aggregating devices (aFAD). The main contributions to the implementation of the Commission's Programme of Work were received from various Trust Fund programmes mostly supported by the European Union Directorate-General for Maritime Affairs and Fisheries (EU DG Mare) and FAO's regular programme. Joint activities with Caribbean Fishery Management Council (CFMC), Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species (CITES), National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism (CRFM), Organization of the Fisheries and Aquaculture Sector of the Central American Isthmus (OSPESCA), the Gulf and Caribbean Fisheries Institute (GCFI), and other partners engaged during the celebration of the International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture, further contributed to the implementation of a range of interventions of the joint Working Groups.
- 2. The Scientific Advisory Group (SAG), at its 12th session held electronically on 19-20 June 2023, reviewed and approved the updated individual workplans of five of the 11 working groups. SAG also reviewed the draft instruments and recommendations made by two working groups. In their review, SAG recommended a few text edits to the recommendations and further consolidation of the conservation and management measures, requesting the amendments be submitted within 15 days of receipt of the suggested guidance.
- 3. The aforementioned workplans along with guidance from the Executive Committee and activities of the ad hoc Intersessional Working Group (IWG) established by WECAFC17 (which is tasked with implementing the Roadmap for progressing towards the development of a model for a regional fisheries management entity or arrangement in the WECAFC area), were the basis for this updated Work Programme for the period 2023-2025. The overall budget was maintained at the same level as the last approved 2022-2024 WECAFC Work Programme, according to which, excluding the working groups which did not provide actual estimates (about five of the 11 WGs), the budget was some USD 2 million.
