A respectful dialogue

Regional CSA alliances, networks and processes are:

- Voluntary processes
- Bottom-up processes
- Independent processes
- Context-specific processes
- Multi-stakeholders platforms with their strengths and weaknesses
- Not subsets of GACSA but partners

Need to:

- ➢ Be respectful of their specificities
- > Be **inclusive** of their diversity
- Listen their voice and be open to dialogue
- Understand the regional contexts: farming systems, regional trends, policy agenda, ecosystem of stakeholders, patterns of partnerships, etc.
- Have a joint steering process for reinforcing ownership



A continuous engagement

- 1. Introducing GACSA and exchanging views
- 2. Invitation to participate in, and speak at the 2016 GACSA Annual Forum
- 1st Technical Meeting to meet each other, share experiences and lessons learnt, and identify issues of mutual interest for potential collaboration
- 4. Building a joint program of work (2016-2017) based on issues of mutual interest
- 5. **Being supportive of each region**, even if only a light support is being brought
- 6. Seizing opportunities!! Collaborations with various regions
- 7. **Expending** to new regional networks and processes through constant outreach
- 8. Invitation to the **2017 Annual Forum**, and dedicate more time and visibility
- 9. **2nd Technical Meeting**: report on progress + update work program (2018-2019)
- 10. Developing an inclusive study towards joint project proposal(s) for fundraising




A constellation of regional partners

Lessons learnt

- Bottom-up, rather inclusive, independent and voluntary processes, with specific objectives, functioning and institutional setting
- Developed on an ad hoc basis through region and context specific approaches
- Diverse in terms of organizational setting: alliance, network, platform, hub
- Diverse in terms of focus: CSA, climate adaptation, climate resilience, etc.
- **Diverse in terms of leadership:** government-driven/led, REIO-driven/led, farmer-driven/led, iNGO-driven/led, etc.
- Some include a large number members (various stakeholders), while others are have a limited number (focus)
- Some have a coordination mandate in implementing a regional policy intervention framework or working group, while others are project-based



Lessons learnt

- The CSA Alliances have built consensus and convergence among stakeholders by building consensus on the outcomes of CSA (3 pillars) / "power of CSA"
- CSA implementation is framed by regional and national policies, and each
 country remains sovereign in turning CSA into practice: conservation agriculture,
 agroecology, precision farming, etc., and it is usually a mix based on local context,
 production basins, policy priorities, etc.
 - CSA is not an agricultural model, nor a set of practices: it is an approach to climate action in agriculture, addressing jointly adaptation, mitigation and productivity / food security
- CSA and Agroecology are not competing, and can be complementary:
 - Example of West Africa: CSA intervention framework of the regional agricultural policy
 → national & regional programs on agroecology, conservation agriculture, sustain. intensif.,...
- Most of the time: no major issue in engaging regional NGOs, CSOs, farmers' organizations, women organizations, etc.



Lessons learnt

- Regional CSA Alliances are embedded in, and/or aligned with regional and continental agendas and frameworks:
 - Regional agricultural policies, climate change strategies, CSA intervention framework, multi-sectoral framework on climate change, ministerial conferences/councils, regional working groups, etc.
- Regional CSA Alliances are also part of global agendas (COP, SDGs)
 - several of them being engaged, through their regional economic integration organization (ASEAN, ECOWAS, African Union) with the COP process of the UNFCCC (e.g. SBSTA, GCAA)
- Regional CSA Alliances are facing similar issues...
 - Demonstrating their value added, engaging with members, coordinating large-scale group of stakeholders, strengthening inter-sectoral consistency for CSA, communicating effectively, and mobilizing resources
- ... like GACSA is!



Joint work program 2016-2017

Objective 1: To foster knowledge exchange, experience sharing and cooperation building on issues of mutual interest among the CSA alliances

- Activity 1.1: Develop a light mechanism to foster dialogue and exchange
- Activity 1.2: Organize meetings for cross-learning on issues of mutual interest (e.g. demonstrating value-added; promoting CSA; engaging with members; mobilizing resources)
- Activity 1.3: Develop linkages between the regional alliances and the GACSA Action Groups

Objective 2: To foster dialogue and inclusiveness between the CSA alliances, networks and processes

- Activity 2.1: Organize Annual Forum sessions and events for the regional alliances
- Activity 2.2: Ensure GACSA's participation to key meetings of regional alliances
- Activity 2.3: Facilitate cooperation and articulation among the CSA Alliances in Africa

Objective 3: To develop joint and mutually beneficial communication activities
