## Main control measures in wild boar population

- SAMPLING AND TESTING OF WILD BOAR
- CARCASS COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL
- SELECTIVE HUNTING
- SUSTAINABLE FEEDING RESTRICTIONS
- CONTINUOUS AWARENESS



#### **SAMPLING AND TESTING OF WILD BOAR**

Sampling of wild boar conducted by official, authorized veterinarians or trained hunters. Samples are tested for the presence of ASF antibodies (ELISA) and genome (RT-PCR) Sampling principles:


- 1. Found dead or suspected in all country
- 2. All Hunted WB in Part II and Part III

ASF cases in 2017 (16.11.2017)

#### **CARCASS COLLECTION AND DISPOSAL**

Carcasses and offal should:

- 1. buried on the place
- 2. collected in the special place (pit or place) at the hunting ground.
- 3. collected in wild boar by-product containers.








#### **SELECTIVE HUNTING**

Financial support in combination with informative campaigns rise hunting activity and wild boar female hunting as well.



Since 2014 estimated number of wild boar has decreased by 70%



#### SUSTAINABLE FEEDING RESTRICTIONS

Winter feeding is restricted in all territory of Latvia (Regulation of Cabinet of Ministers is in place since December 10, 2014)

- Feeding directly on the ground is prohibited
- · Use of feeders with dosage option only
- Restrictions on the amount of feed– 400 l to 1000ha



Baiting (attraction) is important tool for hunting!!!







Feeding or baiting don't play important role in mild winter or under certain condition...





### **AWERENES**

NON stop Awareness campaign.

Education – seminars, meeting etc.

Collaboration with hunting association.



### CONCLUSIONS AND FURTHER PERSPECTIVE

- 1. ASF control in wild boar remains as permanent challenge;
- 2. Current measures applied to control ASF in wild boar population should be continued as there are no alternative;
- 3. Efforts should be focused on the improvement of hunting biosecurity and limitation of the role of human factor in the spread of ASF virus.
