







LSD in Africa

- Since 1929 LSD spread from Zambia across the continent, including Egypt
- One of the main diseases hampering development of intensive cattle production in Africa

- High-producing dairy cows are very susceptible compared to Afrikaner/cross cattle breeds
- Epidemiology of LSD differs between Africa, the Middle East and Europe
 - Characteristic farming practices and nomadism
 - Direct and indirect contacts with wild ruminants occur via common grazing
 - Environmental factors, climate, vegetation and abundance of insect and ticks
 - Vaccination policies vary between affected countries in the region
- · Recent reports from South Sudan, Namibia, Burundi, Zambia, Zimbabwe
- · Never reported in Algeria, Morocco, Tunisia and Libya

LSD in the Middle East

- Outbreaks have been reported in the region since 1989 –
 Egypt (2012-15) Lebanon (2012-13 and again 2016), Israel
 (2012-13), Palestinian Autonomous Territories (2013-?),
 Jordan (2013-16), Iraq (2013-16), Kuwait (2014-16), Iran
 (2014-16), Saudi Arabia (2015-2016), Bahrain (2015)

- Oman (2009-16)
- Syria, United Arab Emirates, Yemen?
- Uncontrolled animal movements nomadism and communal grazing
- Substantial importer of live cattle from the Horn of African countries
- Importation of live animals lacks sufficient control

LSD outbreak in South East Europe and Northern Caucasus,

- Turkey (2013), the norther part of Cyprus (2014), Greece (2015), followed by Bulgaria, Serbia, FYR of Macedonia, Montenegro, Kosovo and Albania (2016)
- Not affected: Bosnia and Herzegovina and Croatia
- Caucasus: Azerbaijan (2014), Armenia (2015) Georgia (2016)
- Kazakhstan (2016)
- In southern Russian Republics of Chechnya, Dagestan, Kalmykiyan, In the Russian Federation, LSD has spread within 16 provinces → Ukraine at high risk
