### Informal consultation Meeting for Europe and Central Asia 16-17 May 2019, Budapest, Hungary

#### Background

The Informal consultation Meeting for Europe and Central Asia provides a platform on which the FAO Regional Office and Member countries can interact between sessions of the European Regional Conference and facilitates consultation, considering the limited presence of FAO at country level in the Europe and Central Asia Region. Used successfully since 2010, this mechanism has been well received by all countries in the Region.

The main purpose of the informal consultations has been:

- 1) To facilitate an exchange of views among all Members of the European and Central Asia Region
- 2) To inform and update the Member countries of the Region on the implementation of FAO's programme of work in the Region
- 3) To review priorities in the Region in preparation for the Regional Conference

#### Scope of Informal Consultation

The FAO programme in the European and Central Asia Region for 2018/19 is guided by the results from the 31<sup>st</sup> FAO Regional Conference for Europe, May 2018 and based on the priorities three regional initiatives are the key programmatic umbrella for the implementation of the work-programme in the Region.<sup>1</sup> In addition, food security and nutrition as well as gender and climate change have been embedded in the three initiatives as cross-cutting issues, e.g. through nutrition-sensitive agriculture and social protection and sustainable food and agriculture. Using the RIs as programmatic umbrella to increase focus and impact, the Country Programming Frameworks (CPFs) have been under formulation with increased focus to enhance impact of FAO's work at country level and to align to the national SDG plans. The review of the preliminary results achieved during the 2018-19 biennium and of the regional priorities, will guide the future scope of FAO's Regional Initiatives in the context of achieving the SDGs within a decade.

The 41st Session of the European Commission on Agriculture will be held in Budapest in September 2019 and will focus on technical issues related to plant health in consideration that the International Year of Plant Health (IYPH) is foreseen for 2020. The ECA Session will be an integral element of the preparation to the ERC 2020, and will discuss technical issues for decision.

The ongoing UN Development System Reform process means significant changes to the setup, leadership, accountability mechanisms and capacities of the whole UN development system;

ensuring it meets national needs for achieving the SDGs, and meeting the commitments made under the Paris Agreement to address climate change. At the country level, the reform will bring a new generation of UN country teams, centered around a strategic country plan - developed in close consultation with governments - and led by an empowered UN Resident Coordinator, to support Member States to guide system-wide actions and bring greater transparency and accountability for results.<sup>2</sup>

The discussion and results from the Informal Consultation and the ECA Session will guide the workplanning in the Region for the biennium 2020-21, which starts in the second semester of 2019 as well as inform on elements for the ERC 2020. The informal consultation further offer opportunities to discuss priority themes and initiatives for the region, such as the International Decade for Family Farming (2019-2028), the United Nations Decade of Action on Nutrition (2016-2025) and progress made in achieving relevant SDGs.
