## UPDATE ON THE STATUS OF PREPARATIONS FOR THE 32ND REGIONAL CONFERENCE FOR EUROPE

(Tashkent, Uzbekistan)

In light of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the Director-General has decided, in consultation with the Minister for Agriculture of the Republic of Uzbekistan, and discussion with the Europe Regional Group (ERG), to postpone the dates of the 32nd Regional Conference for Europe (ERC) to the second half of 2020. The Consultation of the Civil Society Organizations (CSOs), planned to take place before the Conference, is postponed together with the ERC.

Official letters informing about the postponement of the ERC were sent out in the past week from the Assistant Director-General to all invitees, including Members of the region, observers and associate members, UN Agencies and Inter-Governmental Organizations.

Further information on the new dates, technical and logistical details along with relevant updates will be shared at a later stage in coordination with the Government of Republic of Uzbekistan.
