Working Group on stock assessment of small pelagic species

Ancona, Italy, 26-30 October, 2009

Context and Objectives

One of the objectives of the Sub-committee on Stock Assessment (SCSA) of the Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) of GFCM, is to progress in the enhancement of joint practical stock assessment. “Joint” refers to the participation of scientists from different Geographical Sub-Areas (GSAs) providing their data and sharing them with their colleagues, using a standard methodology and analyzing together the results and options for fisheries management.

The process based on undertaking joint practical session to assess small pelagic species was launched in 2008, during the SCSA Working Group on small pelagic species (Turkey, September 2008). The assessments were carried out using both commercial catches and survey data.

During its Thirty third session, the Commission endorsed the proposal of its Scientific Advisory Committee (SAC) aimed to reconsider the functioning of the Working Groups on stock assessment of demersal and small pelagic species. Under this new vision, the Working group on small pelagic species will carry out its work on sardine and anchovy, dealing exclusively with practical stock assessments using standard methodologies. The outcome of the assessments already undertaken by national experts including with the support of FAO Regional projects and/or other international initiatives would be presented directly to the Sub-Committee on Stock Assessment (SCSA) meeting for review.

The Commission also stressed the need that data required for joint assessments be submitted to the Secretariat two months before the Working group meetings. These practical stock assessments will be supervised by a moderator according to the Terms of reference adopted by the Commission (Appendix J of the SAC report)

Tentative planning of work

1. Review of available data and information
2. Presentation of the methodologies to be used
3. Performance of joint assessments including:
 - Finalization of “stock Assessment forms”
 - Review and analysis of the results of different assessments
 - Formulation of conclusions and management advice
4. Discussion and adoption of the management advice to be submitted to the SCSA
