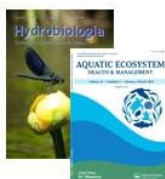

## SOFIA: usage and impact

FAO, specifically, the Fisheries and Aquaculture Department, is partnering the project "Investigating and enhancing the policy relevance of marine scientific information (especially grey literature) through multi-partner collaboration". This project is run by a team from Dalhousie University (Canada) led by Prof. Bertrum A. MacDonald. One of the case studies, that

the Library is involved in is focused on the awareness and use of the "State of World Fisheries and Aquaculture" (SOFIA). **Vanya Avdic**, a master's student from the School for Resource and Environmental Science of Dalhousie University is conducting the citation analysis for all SOFIA editions. To complement this research, during June-July we are hosting a volunteer, **Grace Li**, fourth year student at Princeton University (USA) studying in the Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs with a focus in economics. Under the supervision of the FI Communications and Publications Officer, Grace will examine other data on access and use of all issues of SOFIA, such as web traffic statistics and downloads, media references, and copyright requests.
