Agenda Item 1 Welcome & adoption of the agenda

Discussion:

It had been previously agreed that, due to the Australian elections, Chair Mr Ross Hampton, would be unable to attend Korea in person and, as he would be participating by video, it would be preferable to have the Vice-Chair who could be in the room, oversee the meeting.

The ACSFI Vice-Chair Mr José Carlos da Fonseca Junior, opened the meeting at 14.00 Korean South Time.

The Vice-Chair welcomed members, observers, secretariat, FAO staff and presenters to the 63rd Annual Meeting of the ACSFI. As the meeting was organized back to back with the strategic meeting of the International Council of Forest & Paper Associations (ICFPA), he recognized the excellent cooperation between ICFPA and ACSFI.

The Vice-Chair acknowledged that while it would have been preferable to meet all in person, was grateful for the hybrid set up, which allowed everyone to join online and/or in person in Seoul.

A request for Any Other Business items to be raised in Item 11 was made. No requests were made.

The Vice-Chair welcomed all participants to provide a brief introduction.

Discussion:

The Vice-Chair welcomed Mr Ewald Rametsteiner, Deputy Director of FAO's Forestry Division.

Mr Rametsteiner gave a warm welcome to the participants and congratulated the ACSFI for the work completed in the last year, including the:

- [ACSF Bioeconomy Statement](#) released at the World Bioeconomy Forum (October 2021); and
- Publication: "[The role of forest products in the global Bioeconomy - wood-based products contributing to the Sustainable Development Goals](#)" as part of [International Day of Forests 2022](#) celebrations.

He highlighted that the ACSFI is fulfilling its role in advising FAO, in particular in the area of bioeconomy, a strategically important topic for the organization, as it is part of one of the twenty Programme Priority Areas (PPA) proposed in the [FAO Director-General's Medium Term Plan 2022-2025](#).

Mr Rametsteiner thanked the Secretariat for its support to this Committee.

He provided afterwards, an overview of FAO's priorities. FAO is moving forward with [Strategy for Private Sector Engagement 2021-2025](#) while being guided by a new [Strategic Framework 2022-31](#) that focuses on 4 main areas: [the four Better](#):

1. *Better* production to ensure sustainable consumption and production patterns
2. *Better* nutrition to end hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition in all its forms

3. *Better* environment to protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial and marine ecosystems; and
4. *Better* life to promote inclusive economic growth by reducing inequalities

FAO's work in forestry is currently focused around the following priorities:

1. Halting Deforestation and Enhancing Resilience;
2. Mainstreaming Biodiversity and Restoring Forest Ecosystems;
3. Enhancing Sustainable Production, Use and Livelihoods; and
4. Improving forest-related data, statistics and analysis.

Finally the Deputy Director highlighted the upcoming events that are significant for the Forestry Division:

- [World Forestry Congress \(2-6 May 2022\)](#), which will see the launch of the flagship publication on the [State of the World's Forests 2022 \(SOFO\)](#);
- [Committee on Forestry](#) (COFO) (3-7 October 2022) and related World Forest Week; and
- COP27 (7-18 November 2022) which will provide an excellent opportunity for ACSFI participation.

Mr Rametsteiner thanked everyone and wished all participants a successful meeting.

Agenda Item 3 Noting of the minutes of 62nd ACSFI meeting

Discussion:

Minutes were accepted with no amendments. The ACSFI met all the action points.

Agenda Item 4 Update on ACSFI's 2022-23 work plan

Discussion:

Mr Sven Walter provided an update of the work completed since the 62nd Annual ACSFI meeting and provided an outline of the work proposed for 2022. These outputs were structured around the two areas of strategic priority identified by the [ACSF Strategic Framework 2020-2030](#), Bioeconomy and Ecosystem Restoration.

No comments or objections were made to the proposed 2022 ACSFI's work priorities. The workplan was approved by the Committee.

It was recognized that the International Council of Forest and Paper Associations (ICFPA) is now a representative of the United Nations Forum on Forests' (UNFF) Major Group on Business and Industry, as a result of the contact initiated by the ACSFI Secretariat.



Participants expressed their appreciation on the FAO determination on maximizing the opportunity to work with the private sector in order to achieve the objectives of the organization and overarching objectives such as the Sustainable Development Goals.

Highlights from the FAO Director-General were cited, with regards to the need for engagement with the private sector if the world is to meet the SDGs.

Positive comments were also made on the participation of the ACSFI in the World Bioeconomy Forum, as an opportunity to better understand how forestry can establish linkages with other sectors in support of a transition to a bioeconomy.

Participants reiterated their interest in FAO's work on 'harvested wood products' and 'the role of wood residues in the transition to sustainable bioenergy' as key topics to better understand and highlight the contribution of the forest sector to achieve climate change targets including through the substitution of fossil-fuel based products.

Agenda Item 5 Error! Reference source not found. **Building a Sustainable Circular Bioeconomy in Africa Through Forest Products: trends, opportunities and challenges**

Discussion:

Mr Mokena Makeka, Principal, Dalberg Advisors, delivered insights from the draft joint FAO/Dalberg study: "Building a Sustainable Circular Bioeconomy in Africa Through Forest Products: Trends, Opportunities and Challenges."



The study provides an assessment of the current status of Africa's forest and circular bioeconomy and prospective future trends and opportunities. The report seeks to provide an understanding of the current status of the forest economy in Africa including consumption and production trends, sector entry points, existing market opportunities, challenges, lesson learnt, and gaps, as well as impactful investment cases for the forest and circular bioeconomy. The report is expected to be launched at the upcoming FAO Africa Forest and Wildlife Commission meeting.

The Q&A session included reflections on:

- The important role of cities and the likely construction boom as populations expand and increase in wealth;
- Ensuring that new forests are planted in the right place for the right reason and that existing forests continue to be sustainably managed to realize sustainable production and consumption and conservation goals
- The role of indigenous communities' participation in the bioeconomy

Agenda Item 6 Insights and opportunities for private sector collaboration with the Green Climate Fund (GCF)

Discussion:

Mr Ben Vickers, Green Climate Fund (GCF), Land Use, Forests and Ecosystem Sector Senior Specialist, provided an overview of the Green Climate Fund including its work on forests, in particular, how the GCF collaborates with the private sector.

The Q&A session included reflections on the evolving system of certification and blended finance.

Agenda Item 7 Open discussion on COP27

Discussion:

Mr Ross Hampton, invited members to an open discussion to consider the ACSFI's participation at the upcoming UNFCCC COP27 to be held in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt 7-18 November 2022.

The discussion started with a reflection on the take home messages from the previous COP26 (Glasgow)

The discussion saw the participants express concerns about climate change, including the recognition of the need to meet forest-based sustainable consumption and production goals to meet global climate and deforestation targets.



It was mentioned that it would be ideal to have the ACSFI's active participation at the upcoming COP27. The possibility of a joint event between FAO and ACSFI members could be explored.
