## **Background and objectives**

Transforming food systems is critical to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), but the pace of change remains insufficient. Many countries are facing challenges in translating national food systems transformation pathways into coherent, investible actions that effectively engage governments, development finance institutions (DFIs), and the private sector.

#### This side event will:

- 1. Highlight key barriers and enablers to accelerating food systems transformation (FST) at the country level.
- 2. Introduce the idea behind Accelerator, a multi-partner initiative to accelerate food system transformation in up to 50 countries by 2030.
- 3. Build awareness of the Accelerator's offer to countries seeking to turn priorities into concrete, investible initiatives.
- 4. Engage participants to gather insights on how to strengthen the Accelerator's approach and partnerships.

The FST Accelerator seeks to deliver three interlinked objectives:

 Support countries in converting pathway priorities into investible actions that mobilize the private sector.

- Work with businesses to align commercial goals with food systems transformation objectives.
- Collaborate with DFIs to ensure the availability of appropriate financing tools for these investible actions.

By convening governments, DFIs, business leaders, and operational partners, the event aims to foster alignment and catalyze investment in inclusive and sustainable food systems transformation.
