Report of the Islamic Republic of Iran on Food Security

The right of food is one of the most basic, yet vital numan rights which all the countries and international organizations must unanimously collaborate to realize.

Following the Summit event and according to the seven commitments included in the Plan of Action, the I.R. Iran took effective actions in harmony with WFS goals and in order to accomplish the undertaking for better combi ting hunger of undernourishment.

According to our constitution, meeting the basic human needs- such as food, shelter, health care, education and family life-for all citizens is committed.

In the constitution, strong emphasis is given to some of the key preconditions for national food security such as agricultural development, science and technology, environmental protection, social security, poverty alleviation, protection of women's rights and human dignity.

The agriculture sector has a prominent place in social and economic development in Iran. It accounts for 1/4 of GDP, 1/3 of employment opportunities, 4/5 food supply and 1/3 of non-oil exports.

Studies show that, despite population increases during 1988- 97, the agricultural production per capita index has increased remarkably to 137 percent.

Bread is a strategic item in our food basket. It provides 40% energy and 45% protein in our diet. Therefore, wheat is our top priority. We have reached to self-sufficiency in particularly wheat.

Rice is the second ranking staple in our diet. During the plan rice production increased at an annual average rate of 4.4 percent.

Production of sugar beets increased at an average annual rate of 4/6 percent. Sugar production has almost increased. During the plan period,

production of meat and dairy products increased. In this period, per capita domestic production of meat and dairy products increased.

In general, qualitative evaluations made on the food consumption pattern in Iran by using indices such as percentage of energy provided, shares of different food groups is well as macro-nutrients, show that shares of proteins, dairies and vegetables in our food consumption pattern have to be increases, while share of cereals and sugars should be decreased in the food consumption pattern.

Overview of the most important challenges and recommendations in Food Safety in Iran

- Lack or appropriate policy making in food safety sector
- In adequacy of qualified manpower
- Poor awareness of stakeholders involve in food production, marketing, processing, distribution consumption cycle, and export of Agricultural production
- Lack (f appropriate technology and practice

Recommendations:

- Estab ishment of a unique policy making centre for food safety to coordinate and link training, planning, research in this field
- Formulating National Plan of Action on food safety to protect consumers health
- Formulating food safety standards compatible with code of conduct foreseen in Codex Alimentarius guidlines
- Encouraging industrial and commercial sectors and all stakeholders involve in production, supply, distribution and processing of food production to adhere food safety standards
- Organizing special legal instrument to takle with food distribution distortions
- Acquainting the producers, practioness and the beneficiaries with the required skills for meeting standard codes of safe food production and consumption
- Development of processing and complementary industries and making efforts in prevention of post harvest losses of agricultural production

- Improvir g children growth, rate, provision of micronutrients for all age groups of population, enhancing food security at household level and controlling nutriotional and health risks
- calling for mass participation in this respect at social level
