Governments, civil society (social movements, NGOs, religious groups, private sector and individuals) are coming together to eradicate hunger and poverty. They are planning various activities, with unique structures and interesting plans for the future. They have much to share. Four different National Alliances will be presented: Brazil, Cameroon, the Philippines and the United States of America. An Iranian NGO representative will present views regarding national action and alliances against hunger expressed by the five regional civil society consultations held in conjunction with the 2004 FAO

Regional Conferences.

The Italian Minister of Foreign Affairs (International Cooperation) will chair the panel.
